
Introduction













Alex and Rosie saw a lot of wildlife along the sea wall.



















The sea wall sheltered Alex and Rosie from the cold wind.




















Alex and Rosie saw a frog hiding amongst the water lilies.









Giant sequoia trees are the tallest trees in the New Forest.















