



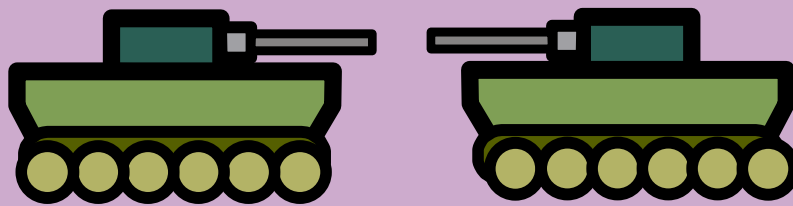

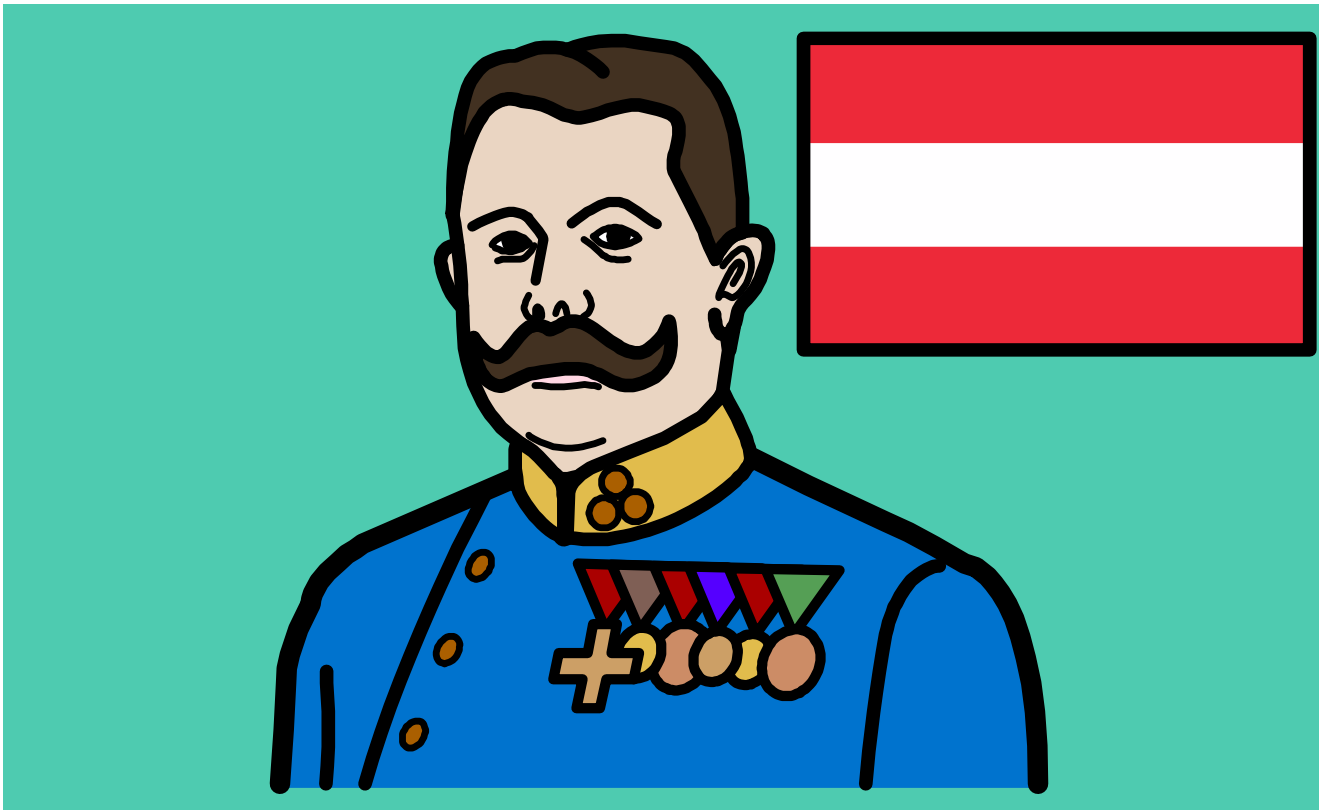

Franz Ferdinand of Austria was assassinated.

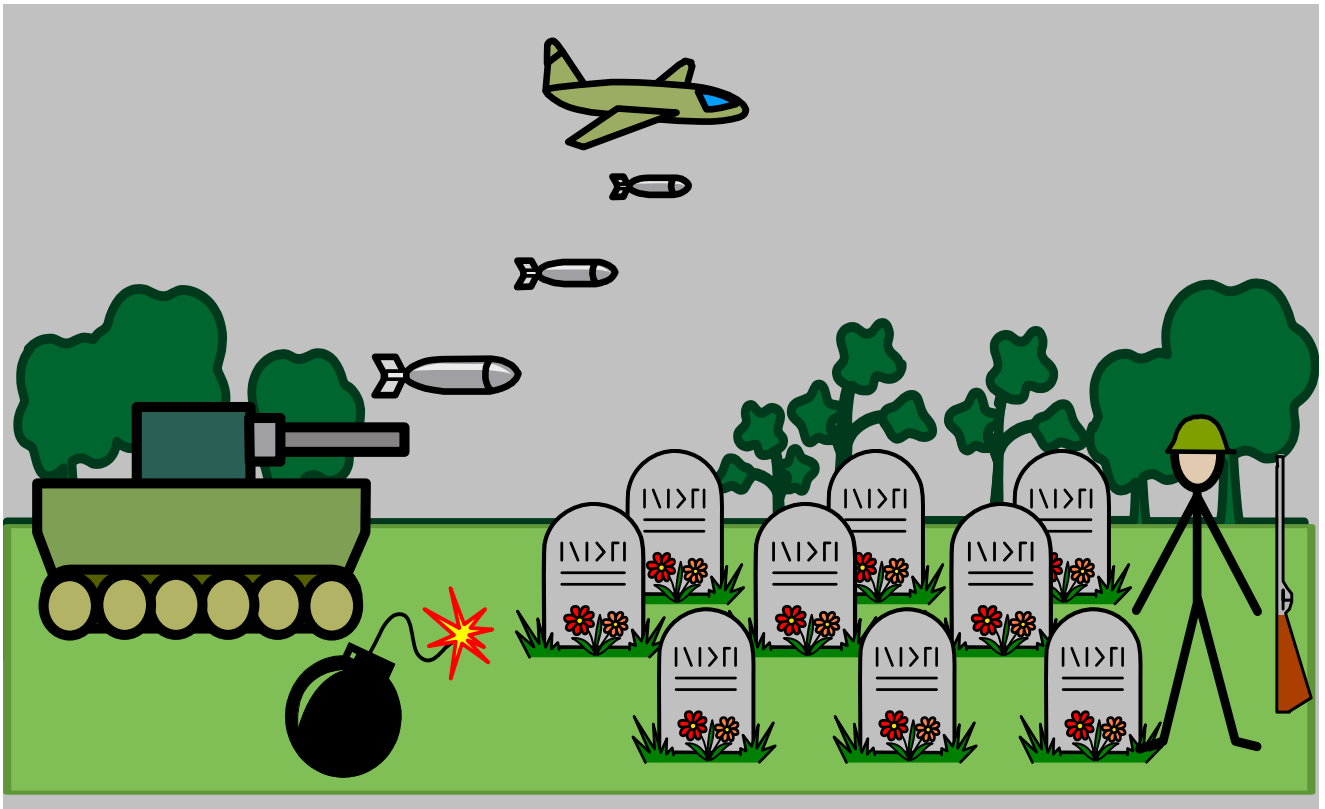


World War One started in Europe.

Germany, Austria and Hungary were united.

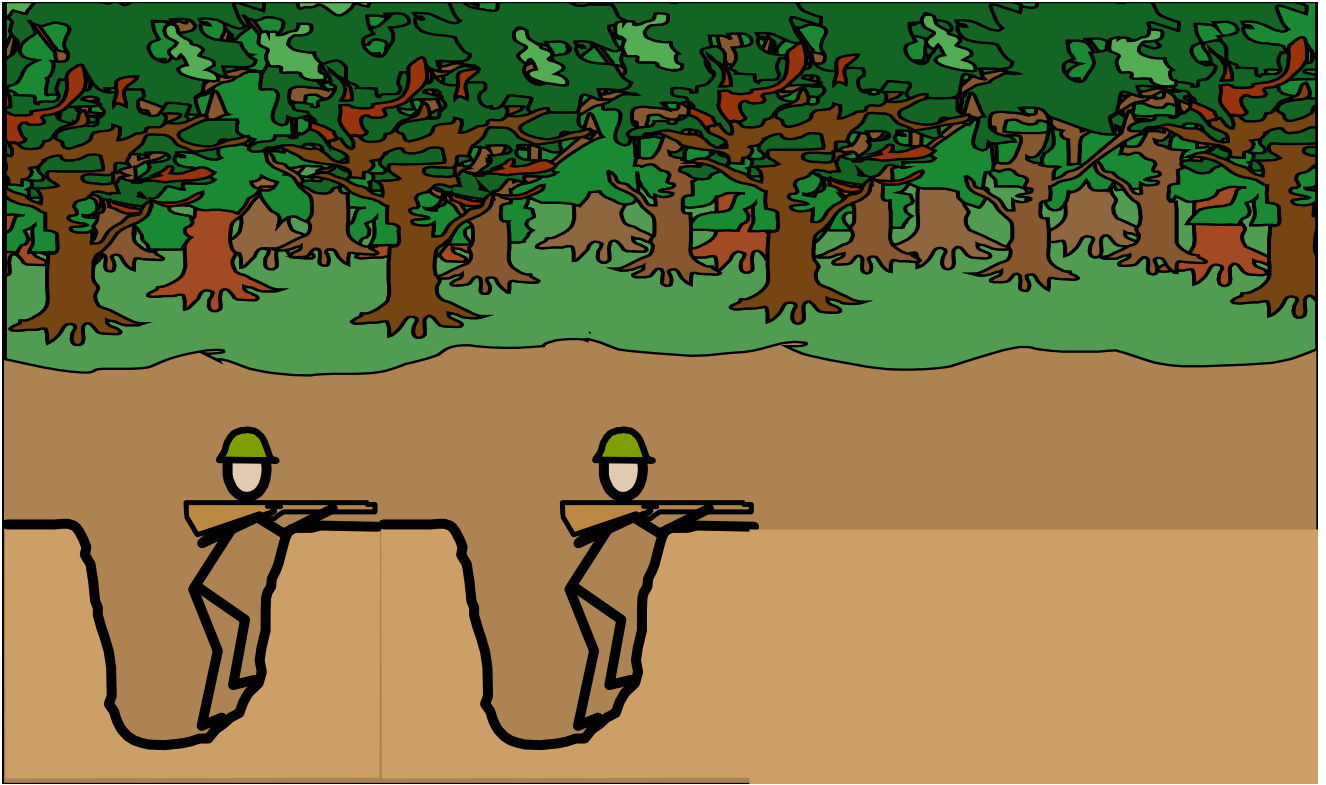


More than 20 million people died during the war.

New weapons caused lots of soldiers' deaths.

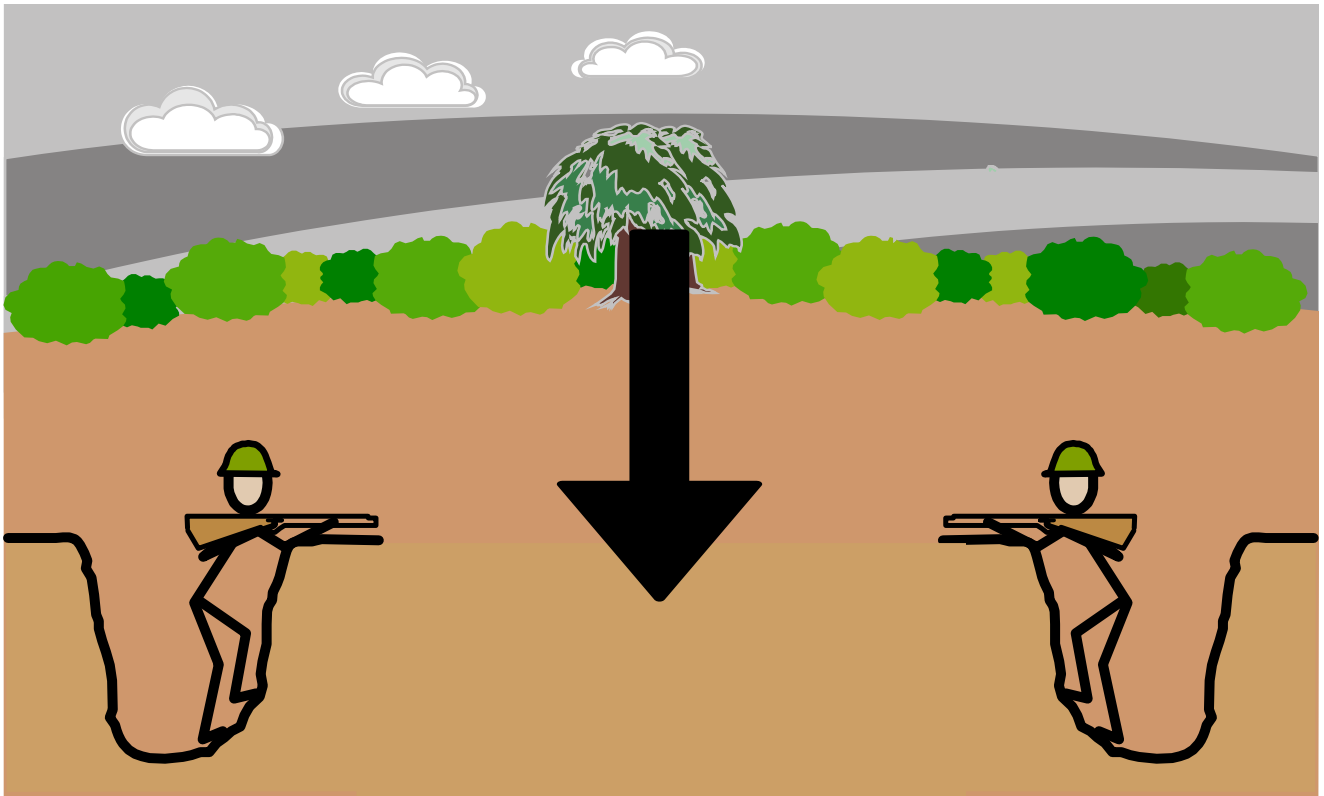


Most of the fighting was in trenches.

Life in the trenches was awful.

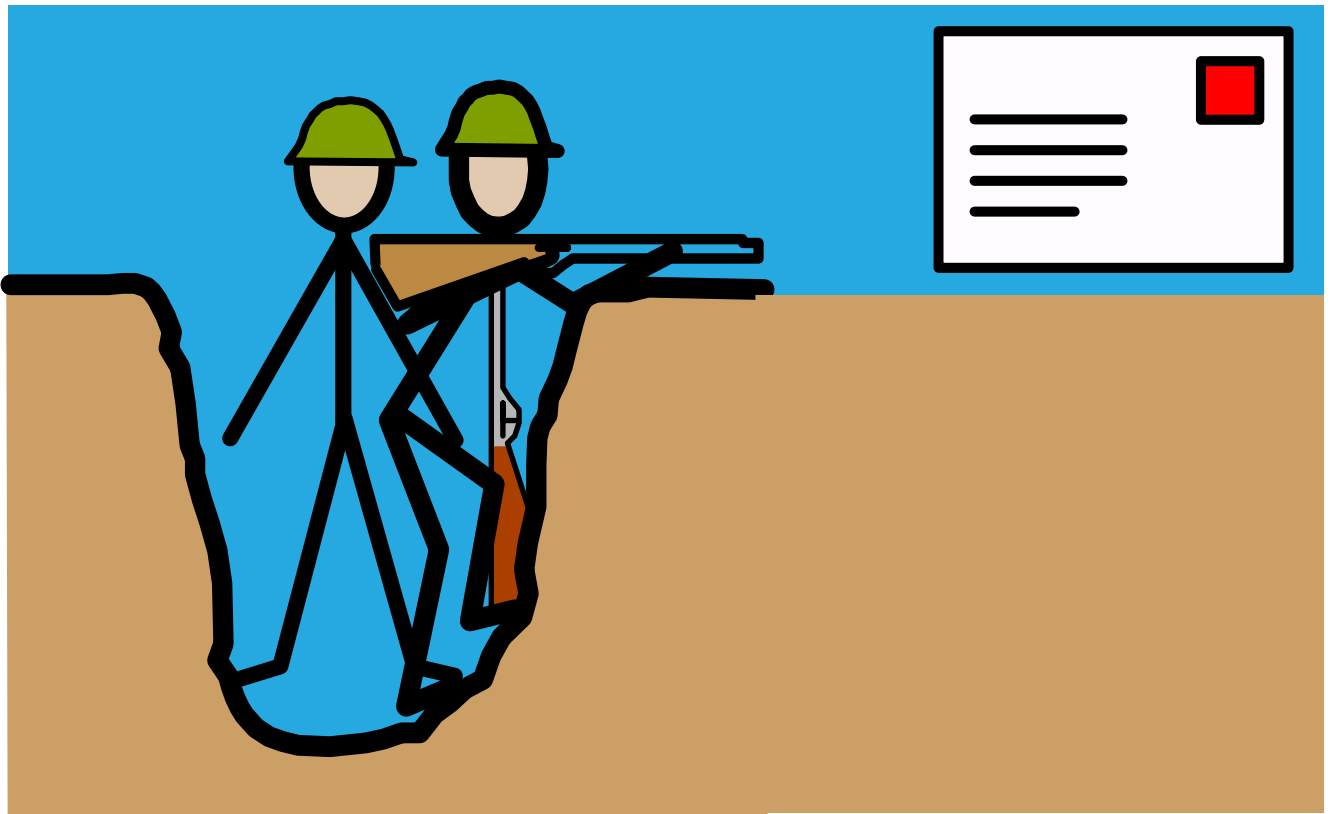


The soldiers ran out from the trenches, when ordered.

The land between trenches was called No man's land.

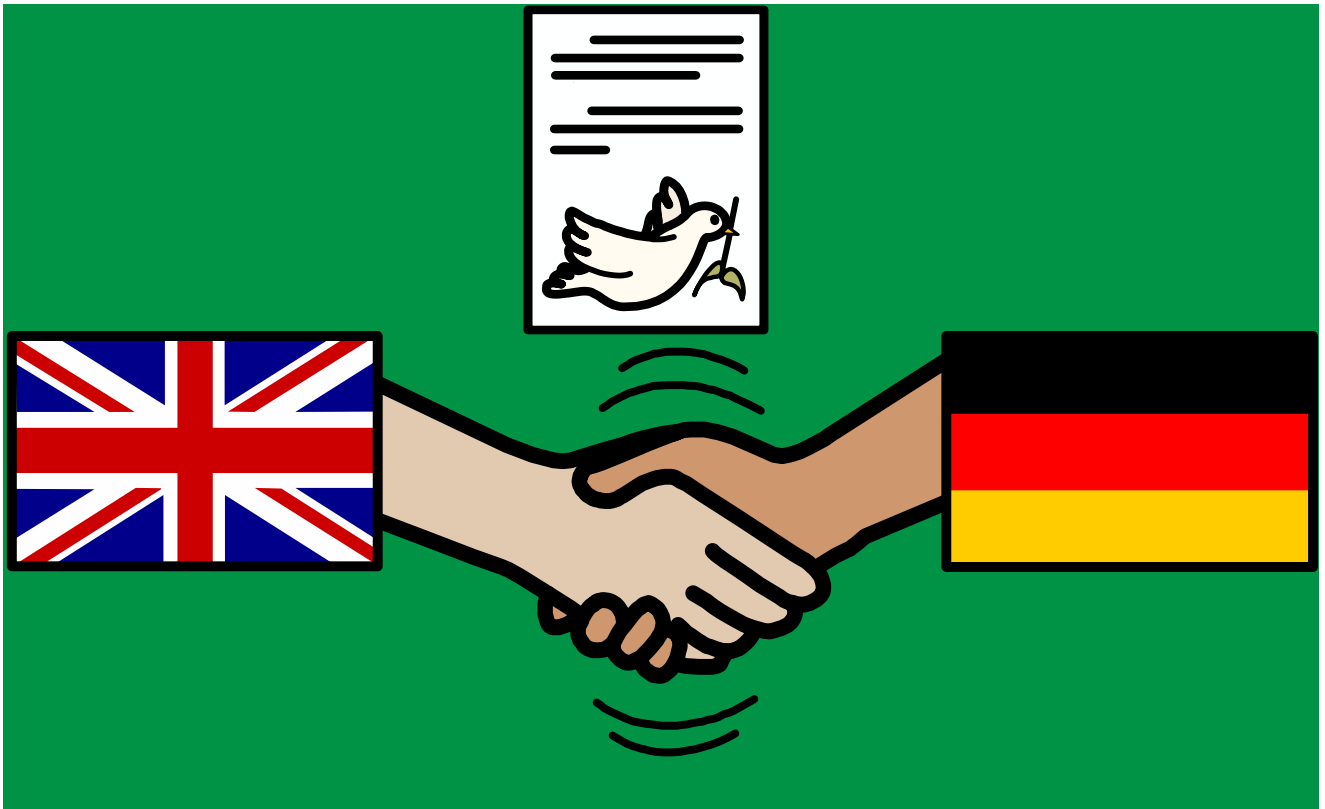


Many soldiers in the trenches wrote letters.

We can learn a lot about WW1 from them.

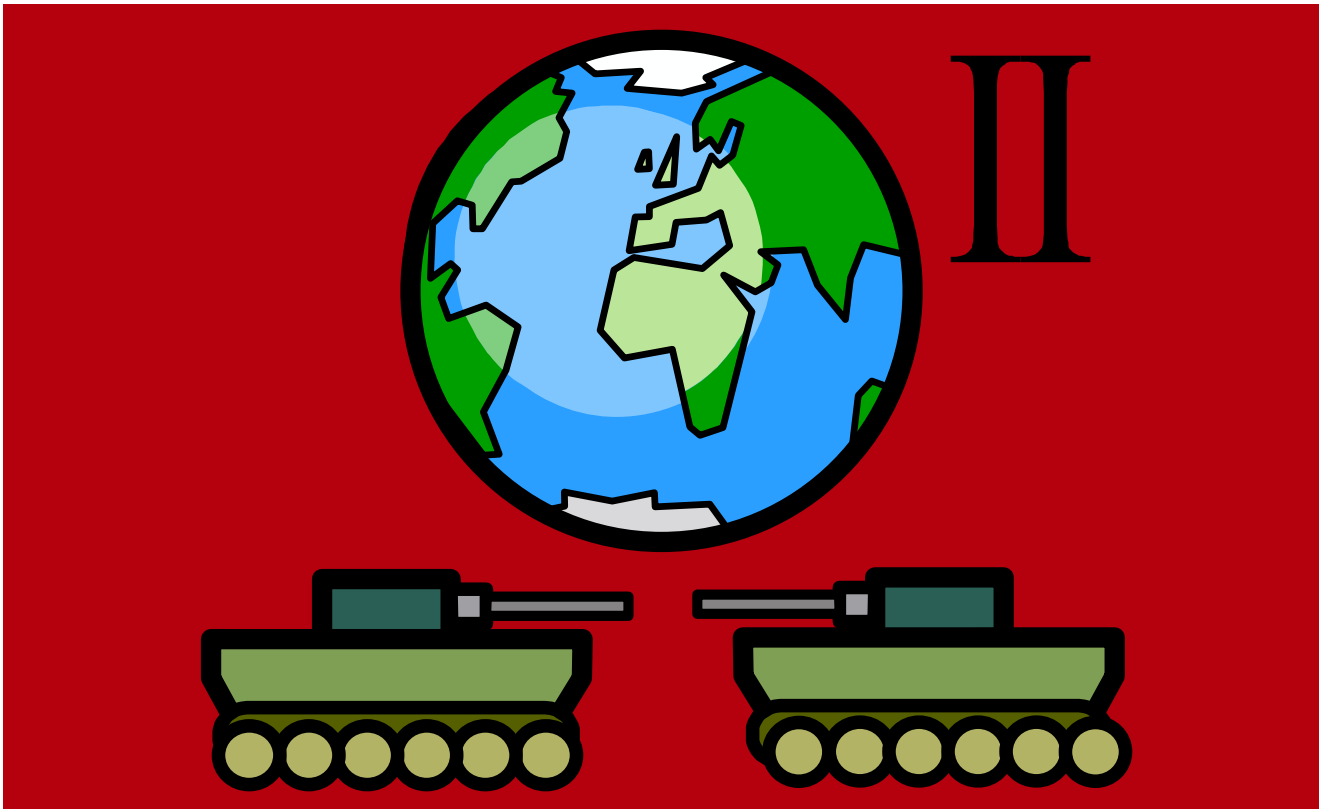


In 1918 the war ended.

A treaty is an agreement to keep peace.

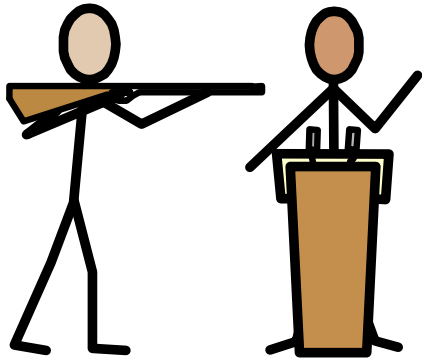


Britain was on the side that won WW1.

Twenty years later, a new war started.

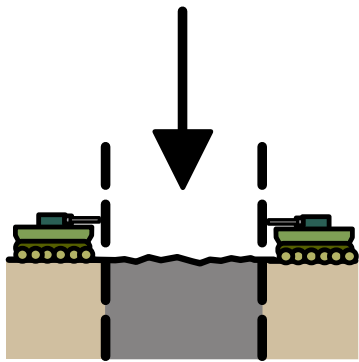
This is called the Second World War.
