

Accessibility: the Britten Pears Arts website includes details on facilities and accessibility at Snape Maltings and a detailed Access Statement for the Red House. The riverside path at Snape Maltings (the start of the 'Sailors' Path') is surfaced, but can be uneven and muddy in places, particularly after wet weather. Parents and carers are advised to check the suitability of the riverside path before visiting with a child in wheelchair. 








Britten liked to travel. He found the Barong in Indonesia.

Jay and Ellie loved the rocking horse in the next room.








