Let's Sign BSL Adult Vocabulary

Introduction

This set contains the full collection of over 2,445 British Sign Language (BSL) graphics as contained in the *Let's Sign Dictionary Everyday BSL for Learners 2nd Edition*.

The graphics are in emf format and in folders ready to insert into documents such as Word, Publisher and PowerPoint to make topic sheets, flashcards etc. to print or display.











The graphics are in black and white line drawings and colour versions, in separate folders. The fingerspelling alphabet graphics are also included.

The recommended reference for searching for meanings/variations of these graphics is the Let's Sign Dictionary 2nd Edition. The book is in alphabetical format and has been designed to support and complement the graphics packs. It contains all of the signs available in the full 2,400 sign collection of Let's Sign graphics. The book is an essential reference tool which provides a succinct background introduction and clear written descriptions of sign movements to accompany each graphic plus additional meanings, regional variations, use in context and index to locate the correct signs. The 6,000 word index is designed to help users locate the graphics needed by their file name and find different meanings associated with each sign.

Our materials are intended to support BSL training and development in the hands of native Deaf sign language users.

The Let's Sign Dictionary and graphics include more than one version of some signs to give choice to suit different contexts, or to suit individual student needs at different stages and includes regional variations.

Fingerspelling also plays an important role in BSL in familiarising learners with the words that match the signs as would be required for use in examinations and future reading and study.
