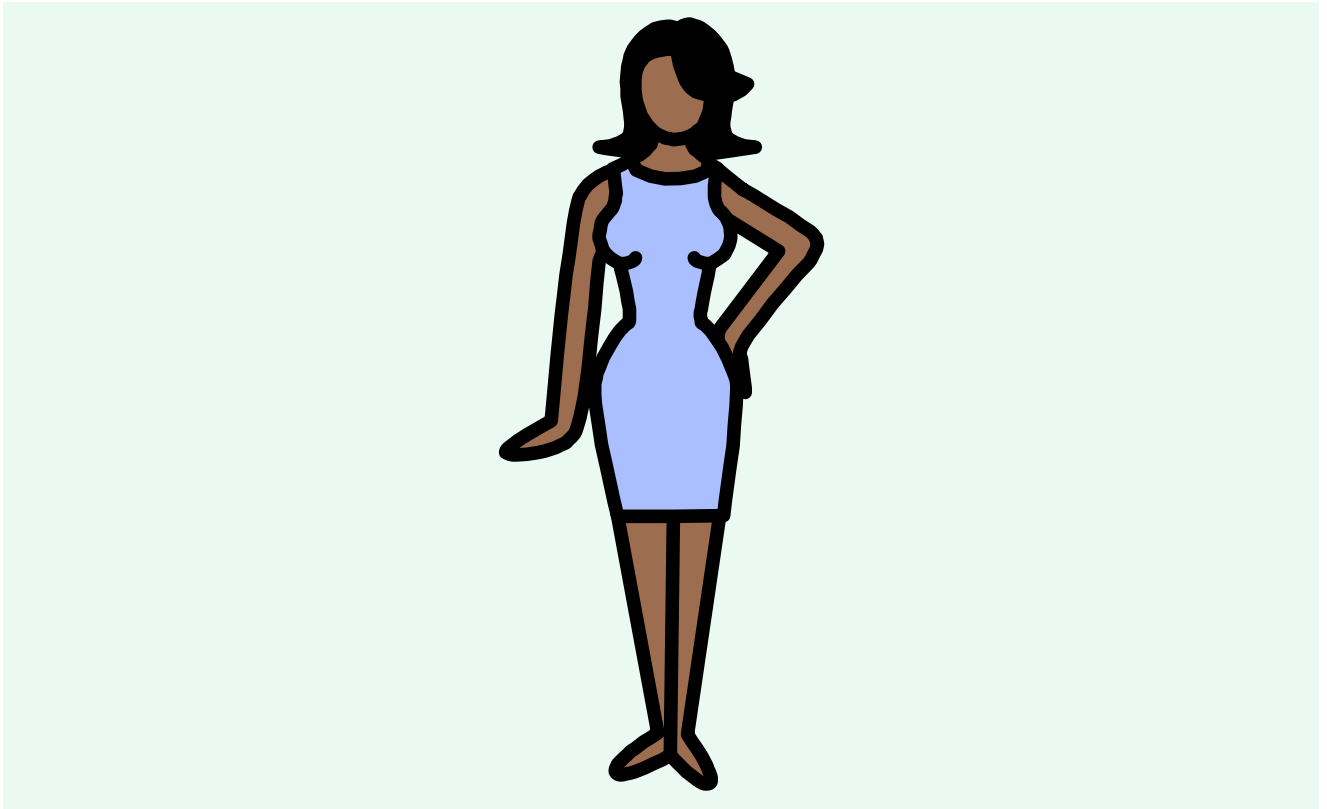


Fanny Eaton was born in Jamaica in 1835.

Slavery had been stopped in Jamaica in 1833.

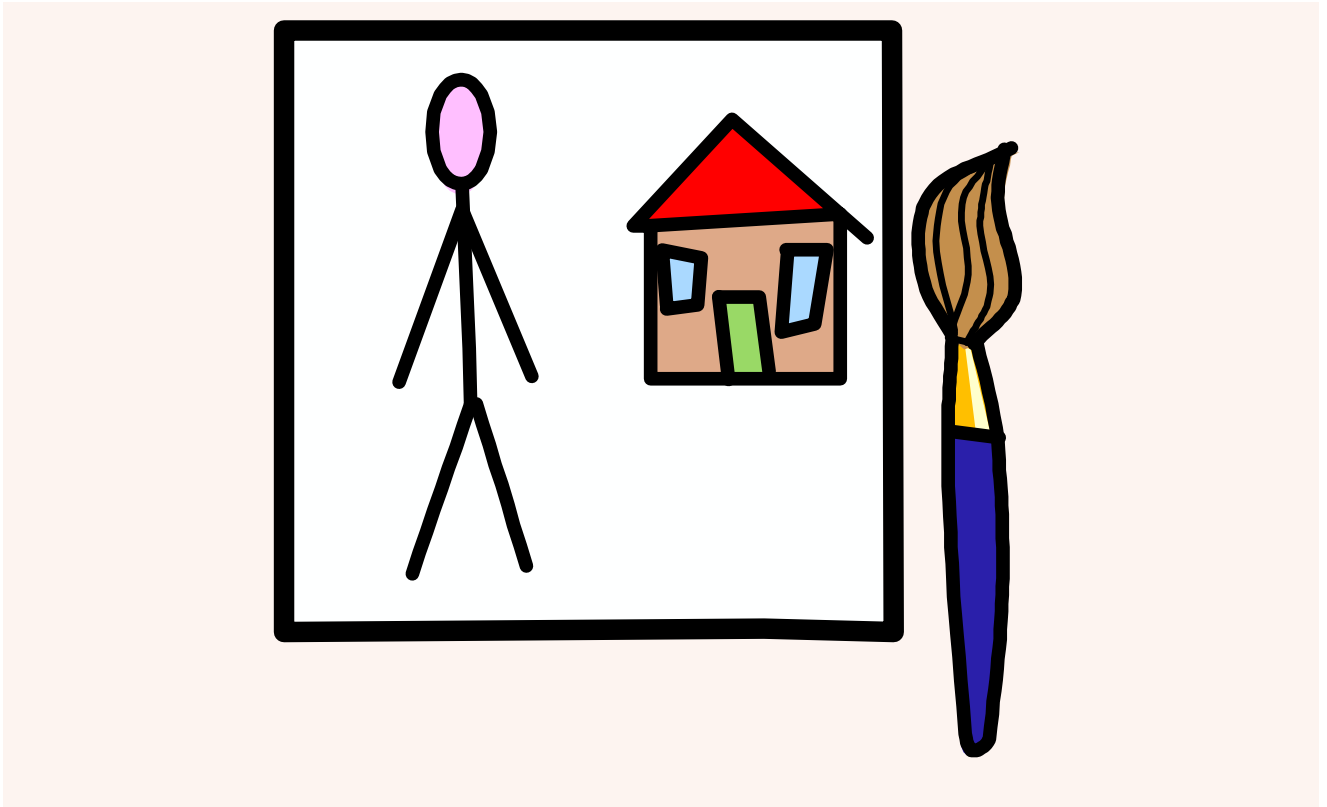


When she grew up Fanny had 10 children.

'The Mother of Moses' became very famous.

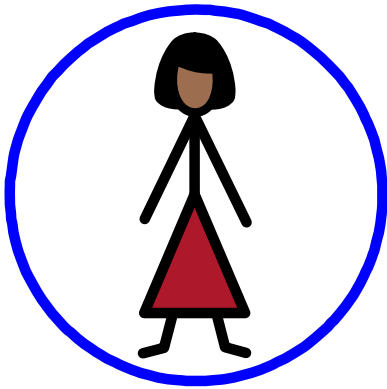
Paintings of Fanny are shown all over the world.



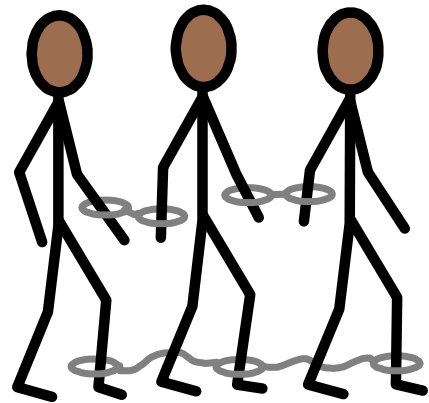
