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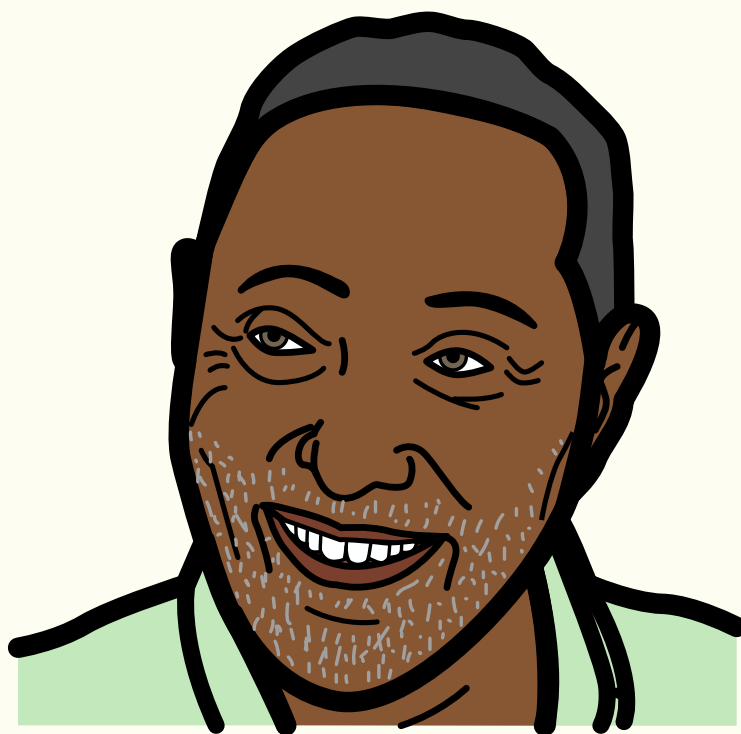
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



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



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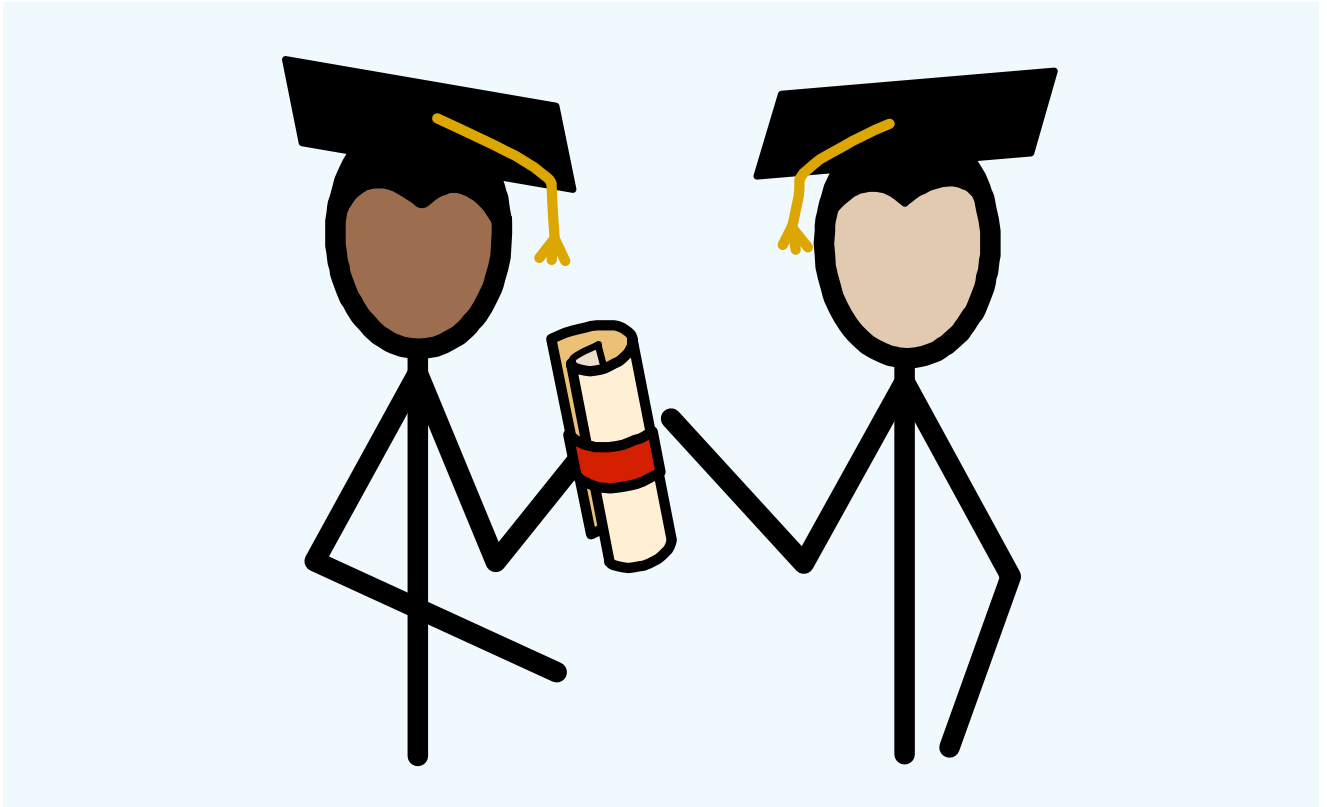


 was  in   1932.

Afterwards he began to study politics.

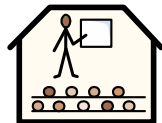
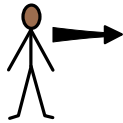
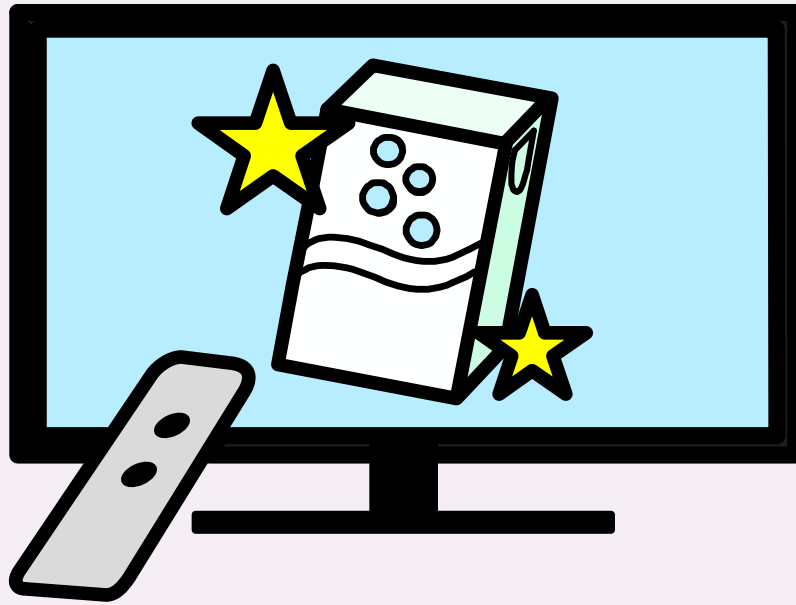


In 1957 Stuart joined CND.

CND is the campaign for nuclear disarmament.

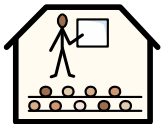
He met his wife, Catherine on a CND march.
