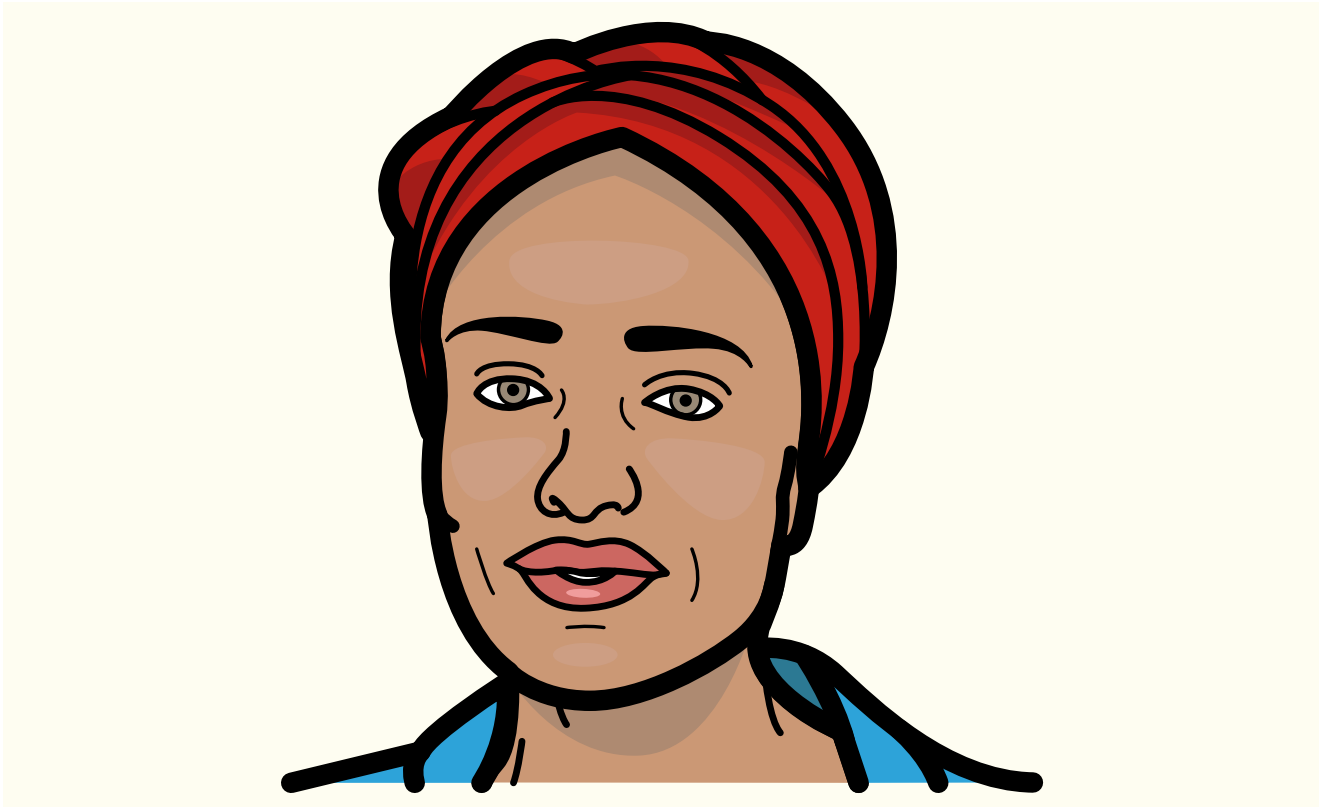

She studied English at the University of Cambridge.

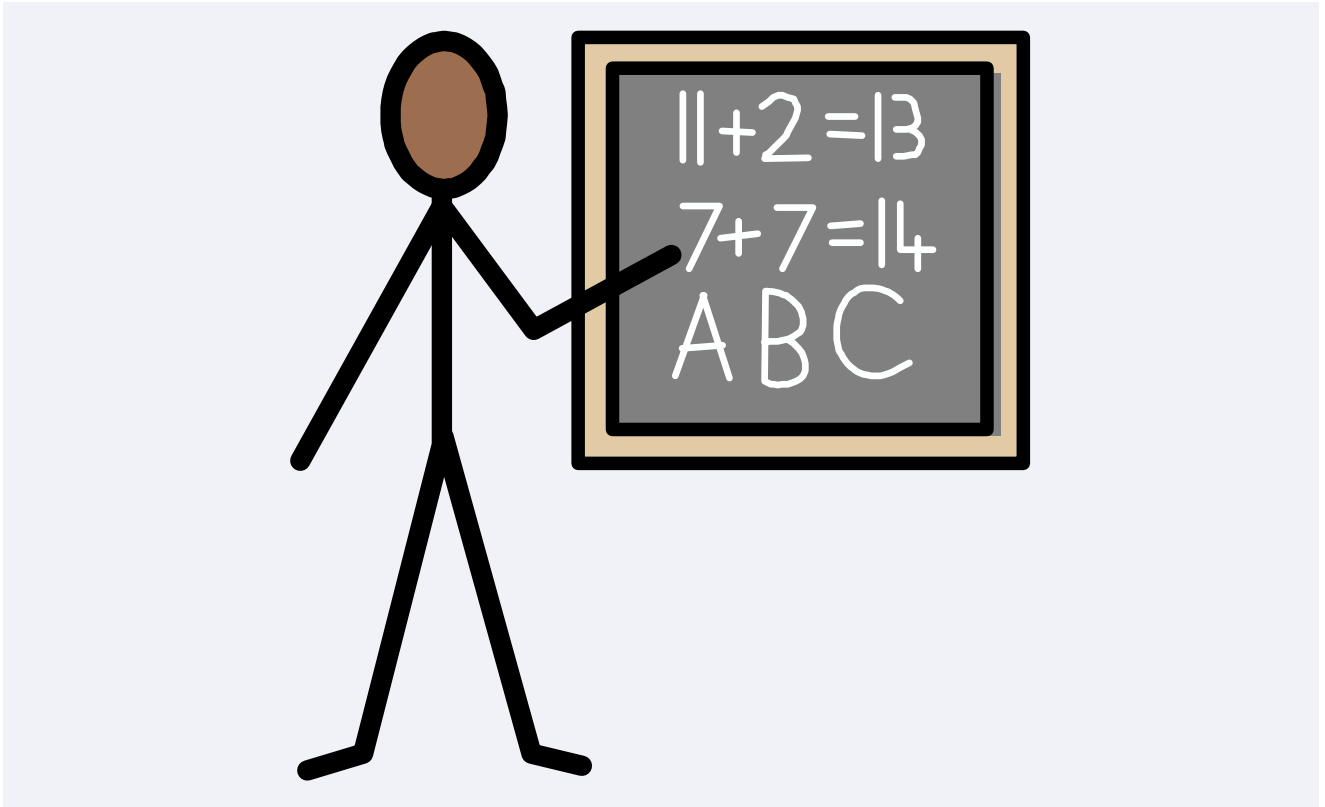


Zadie had her first book published as a student.

Zadie has won prizes for her writing.

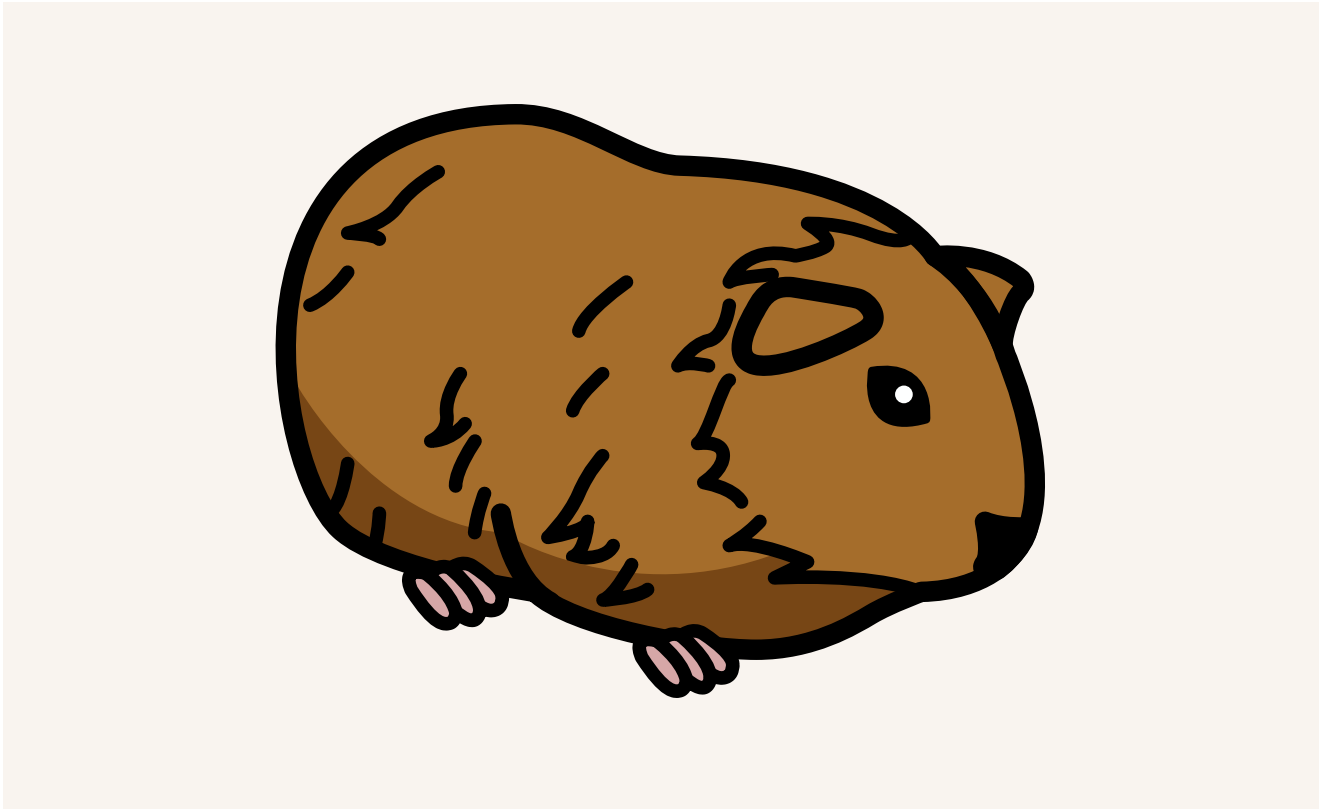


Zadie is now a professor of fiction.

They have two children called Kit and Hal.

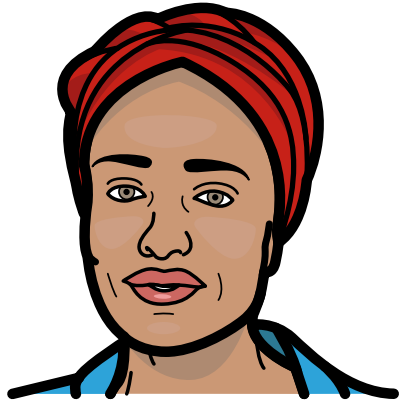


Zadie and Nick have written a children's book.

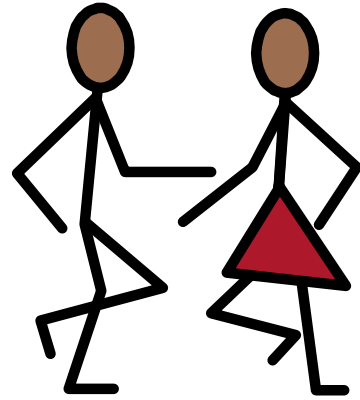
'Weirdo' is about a guinea pig called Maud.

Maud must make lots of brave decisions.

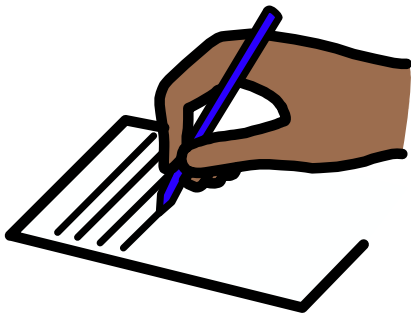
