On **Sunday 7th September** at **3pm**, there will be a national test of the UK Emergency Alerts service.



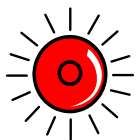
Emergency Alerts is a UK government service that will warn you if there's a danger to life nearby.



In an emergency, your mobile phone or tablet will receive an alert with advice about how to stay safe.



The government does not need to know your phone number or location to send you an alert.



When you get an alert, your phone or tablet may make a loud siren noise, vibrate or read out the alert.



The alert will last for about 10 seconds.



An alert will include a phone number or a link to the GOV.UK website for more information.



You'll get alerts based on your current location - not where you live or work.



Emergency Alerts



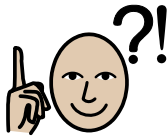
On **Sunday 7th September 2025**, there will be a national test of the UK Emergency Alerts service.



You may get alerts about severe flooding, fires or extreme weather.



Alerts are sent by emergency services, government departments, agencies and public bodies that deal with emergencies.



When you get an alert, stop what you're doing and follow the instructions in the alert.



Stay calm and read the instructions carefully.



Following the instructions in the alert will help keep you safe.
