

When it was time to go, Alex and Rosie ran down the hill.








They enjoyed playing in the playground.

Rosie collected some nice pebbles to take home.










Alex threw his pebbles into the sea.

They worked very hard and collected a lot of branches.










and Rosie were very proud of their den. Alex

They were very happy to hear nightingales singing.










They walked past a lake in the wood.

and Rosie walked all the way round the reservoir.










The sun

was shining and the water was sparkling.










They saw ducks and geese on the water.

They are breakfast, then they went to Sheffield Forest.














Alex and Rosie walked very quietly through the trees.

By a stream, they saw dragonflies chasing each other.












Later, they found beautiful flowers called orchids.

In spring there are a lot of flowers in Birchden Wood.












Alex and Rosie saw bluebells, violets and primroses.

Alex fed the ducks in the castle moat with bread.














Rosie watched swallows catching insects over the water.

Some seeds spin as they fall from the trees.












Alex and Rosie had fun trying to catch the seeds.

Later, they went for a walk in the wood.












Before going home, Alex and Rosie
