This day remembers the end of WW1.



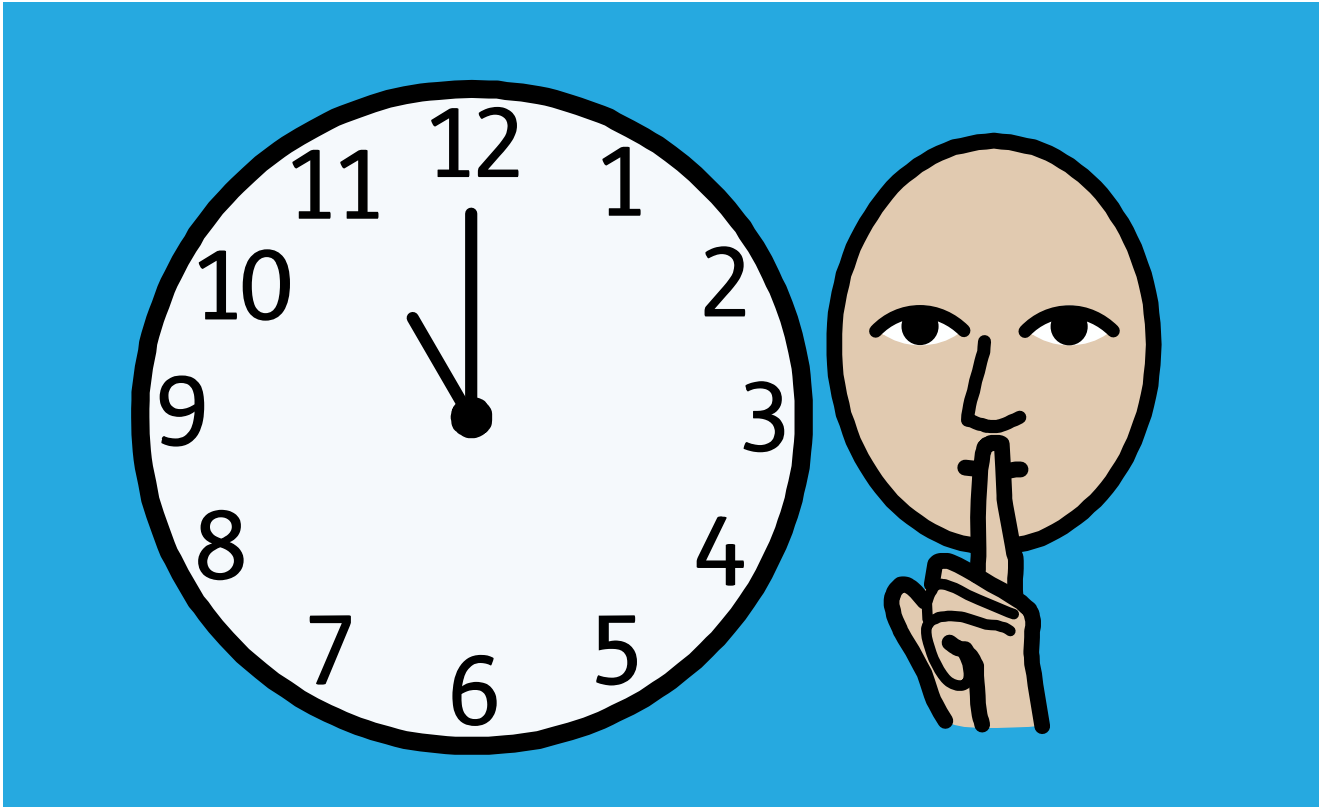










It is the closest Sunday to the 11th November.

The  war  ended at  11am.

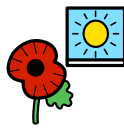
There is a  two  minute  silence  at  11am.

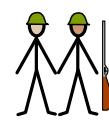
The Cenotaph is a war memorial in London.



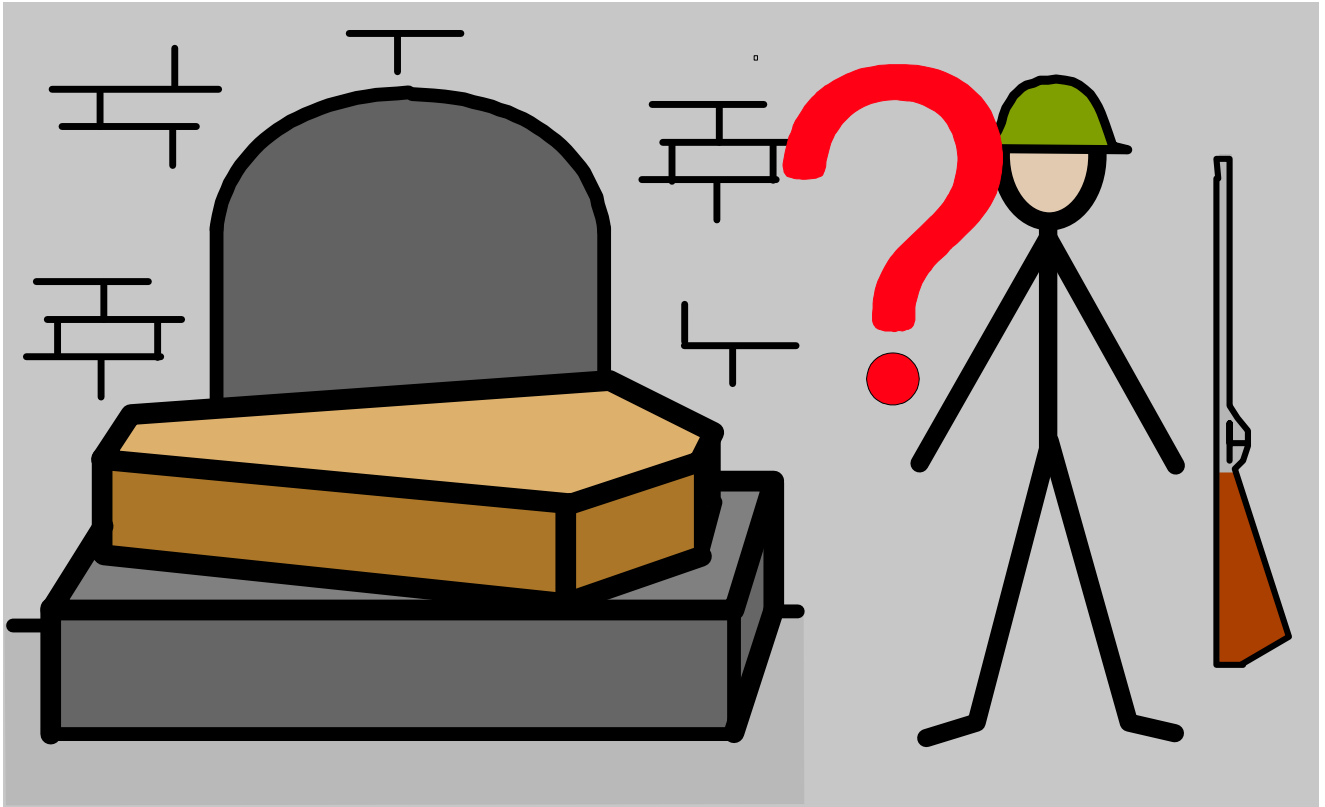
The King visits it on Remembrance Sunday.
