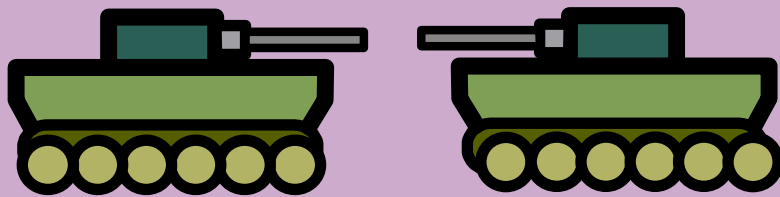

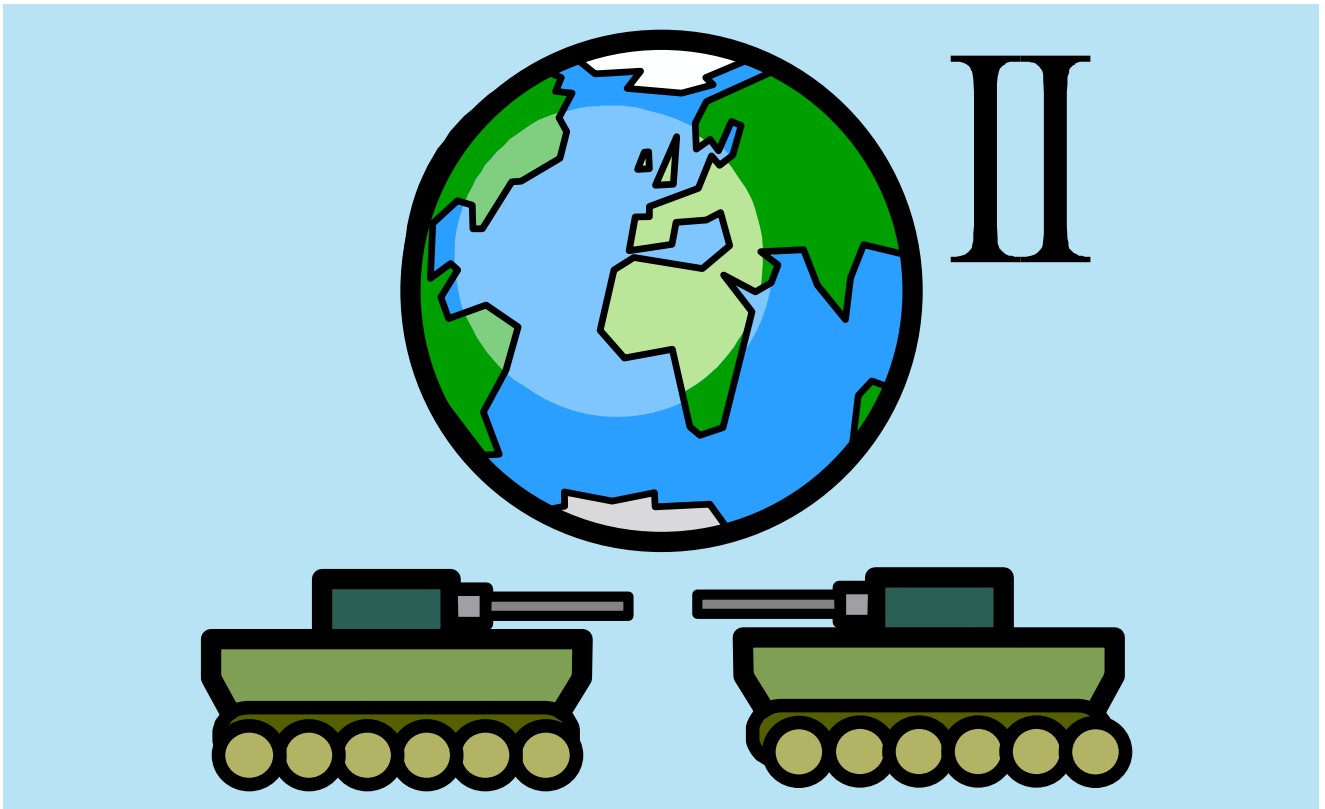

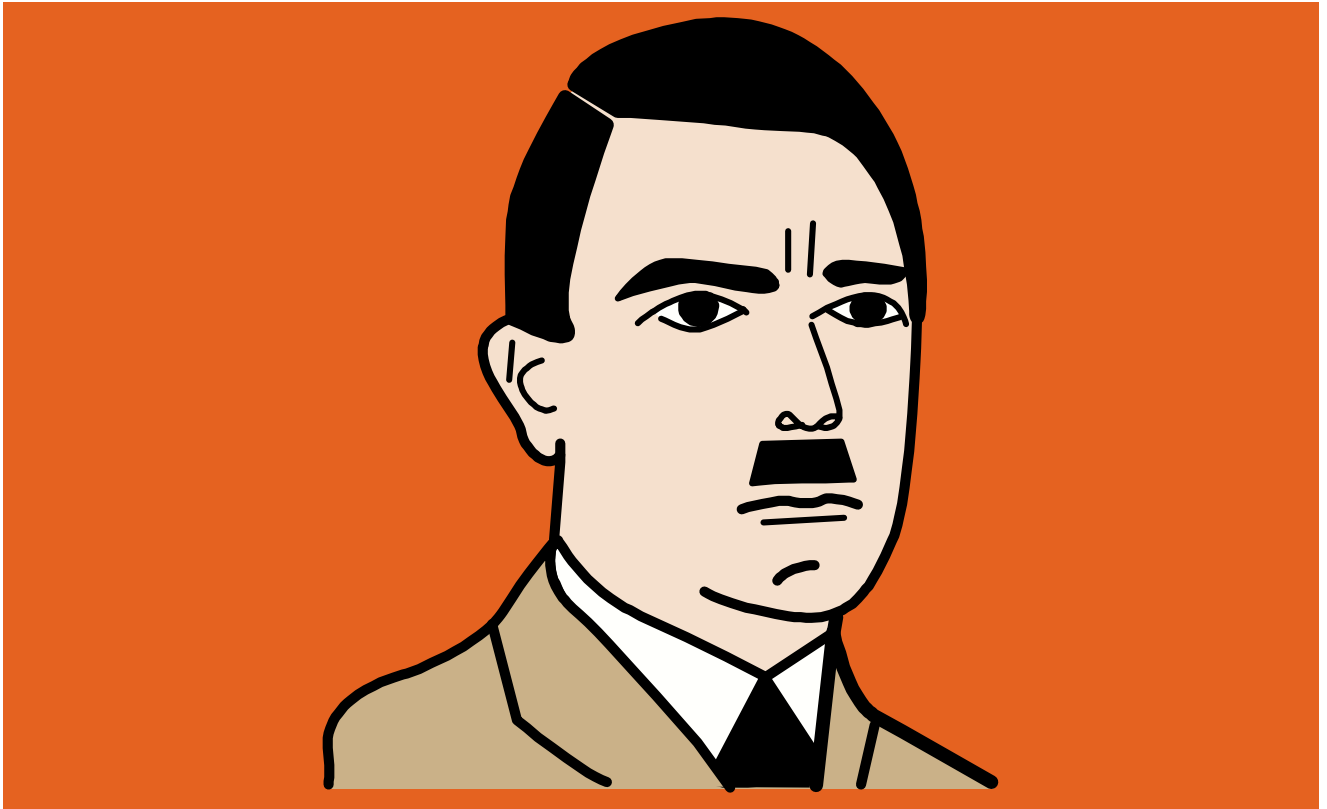


World War Two was from 1939 to 1945.

The speech gave the British people confidence.

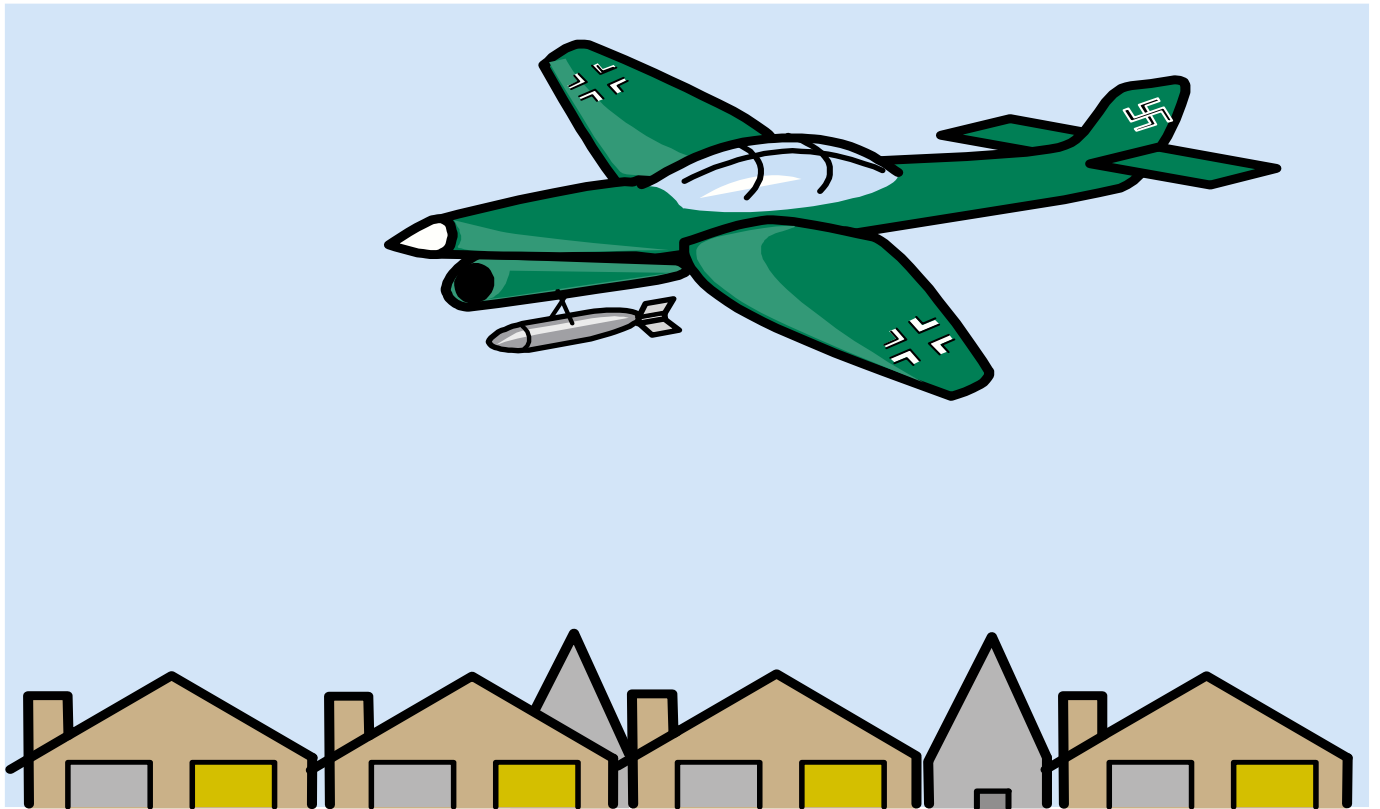


Japan attacked America in 1941.

Atomic bombs were a new invention.

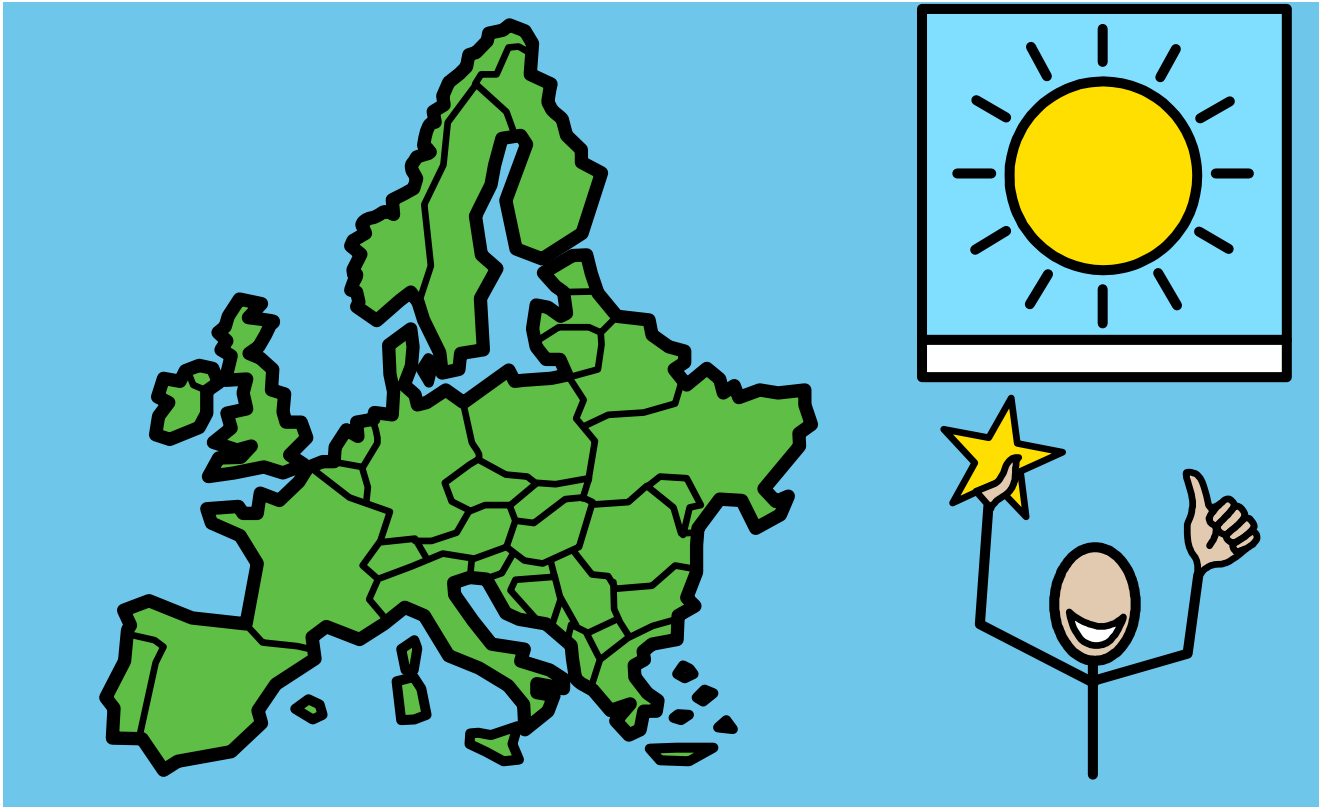


More than 50 million people died in the war.

The bombing of Britain is known as The Blitz.

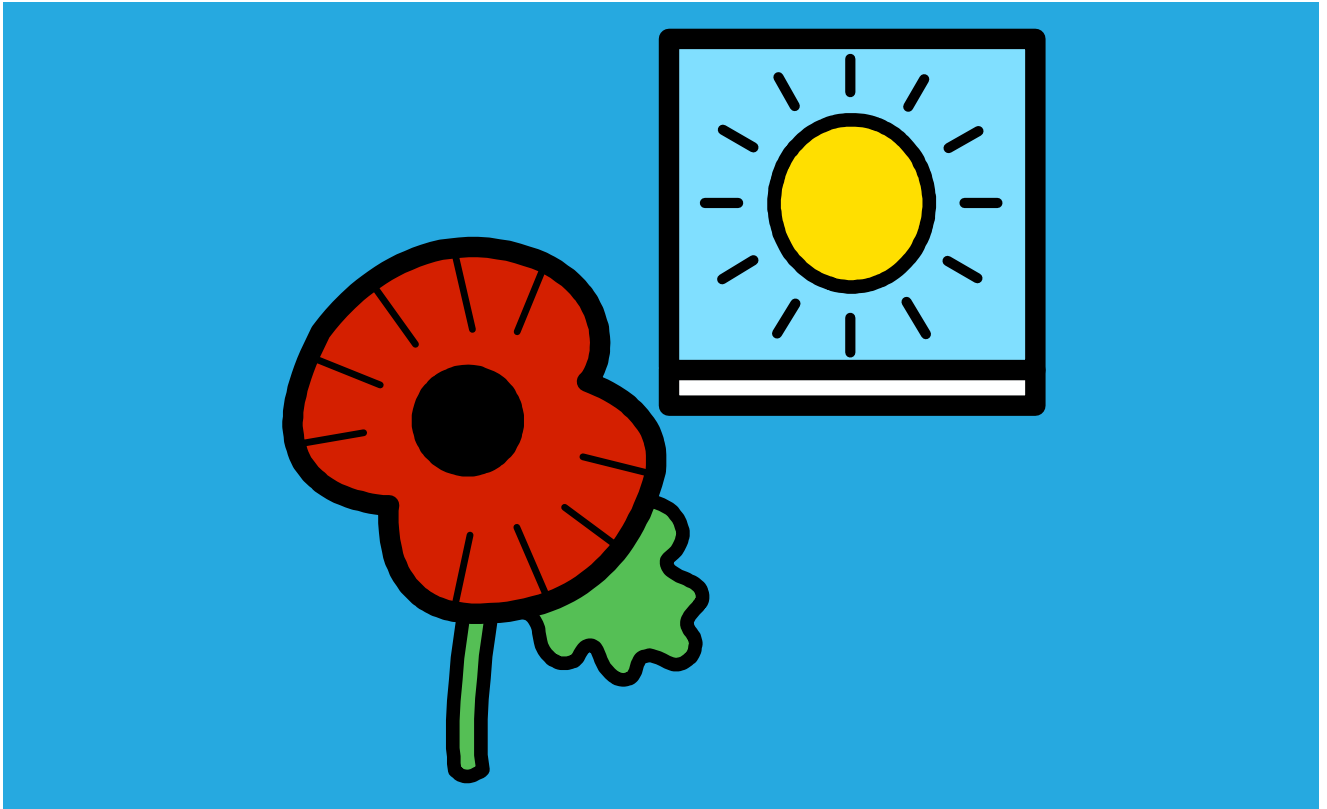


Germany lost the Second World War in 1945.

V E means Victory in Europe.

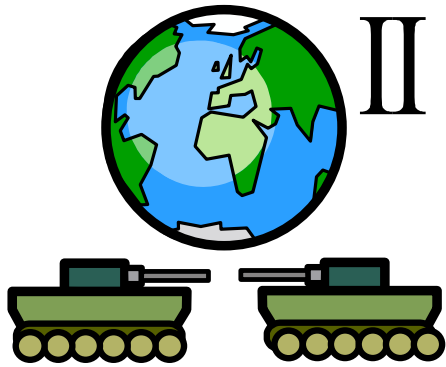


We remember World Wars on Remembrance Day.

We also think about living in peace.

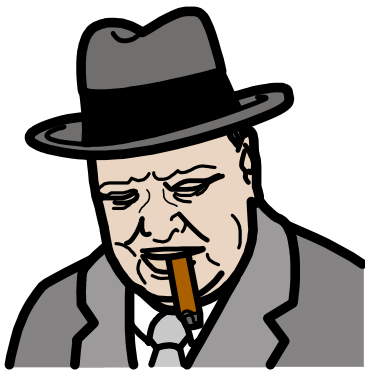
Remembrance Day reminds us war is terrible.



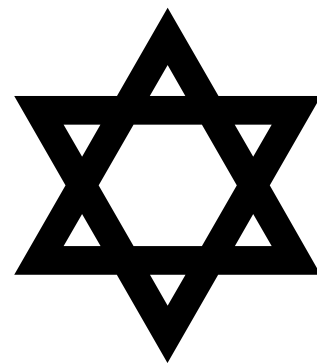
