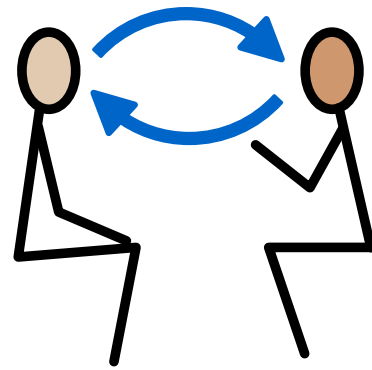


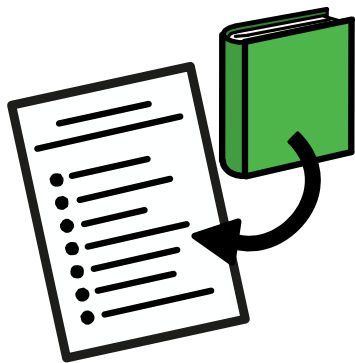
Predict

To say what you think will happen next.



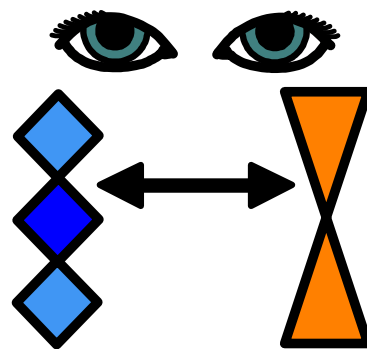
Discuss

To talk about the issues relating to a topic.



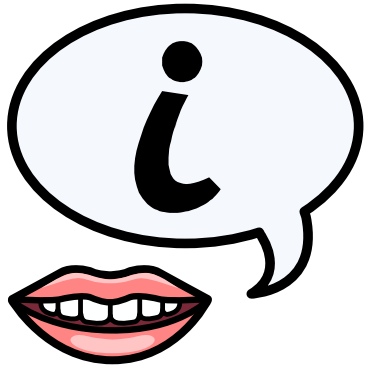
Summarise

To pick out the main idea and key points in a discussion or piece of writing.



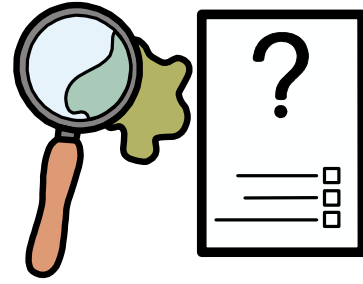
Compare

To say what is the same and what is different about two or more things.



Explain

To give reasons and ideas to help a person understand something.



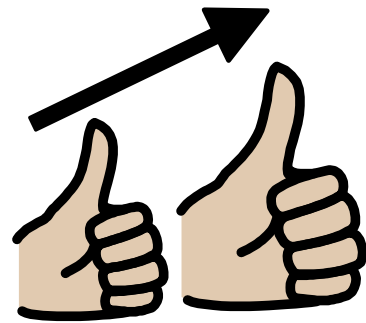
Evidence

To provide reasons for something to be true.



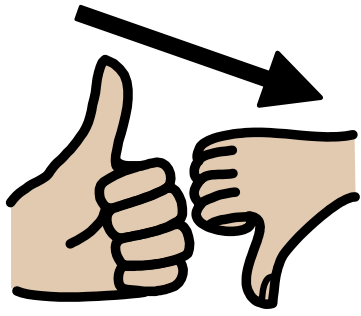
Justify

To explain why something is fair, just or reasonable.



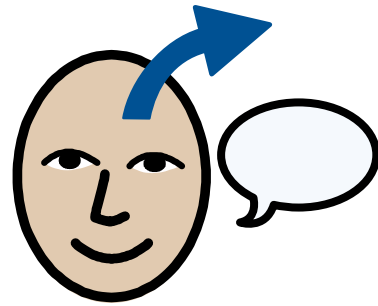
Advantages

To explain why something is useful or helpful.



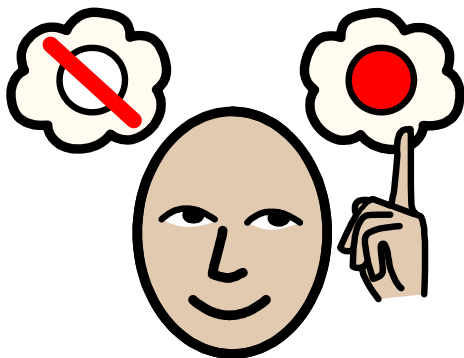
Disadvantages

To explain why something may not be useful or helpful.



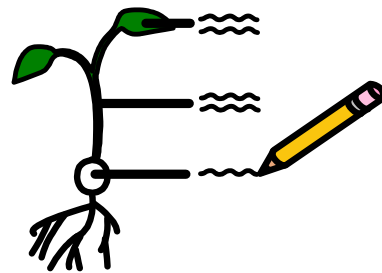
Define

To explain the important features of a word or idea.



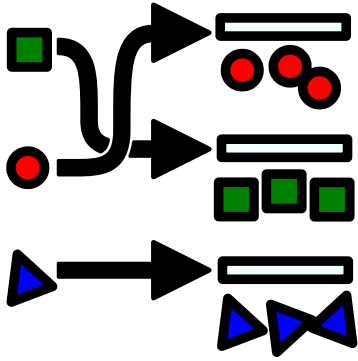
Decide

To chose what to do, or say, or how to act.



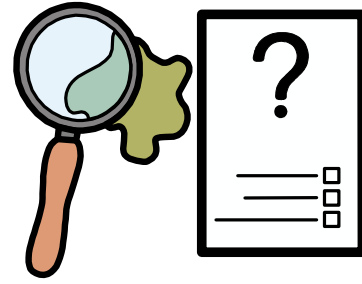
Label

To say or write the name of something



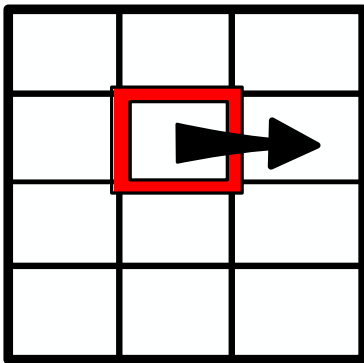
Classify

To sort items according to their similar features.



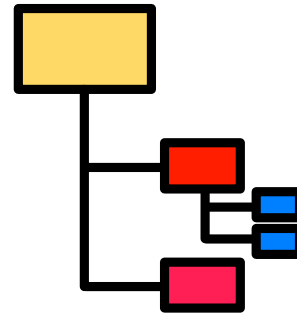
Analyse

To look at something in detail, exploring all of its parts and functions.



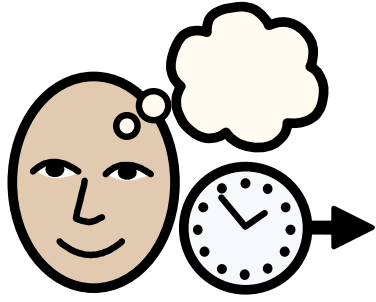
Scan

To quickly look at the information, picking out the important bits.



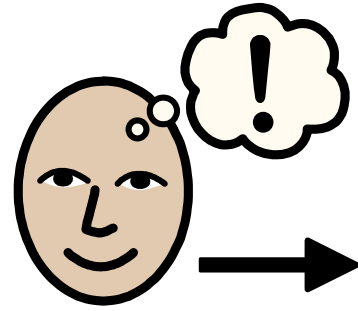
Mind map

To organise information in a word and picture map to show how ideas are linked together.



Anticipate

To expect something to happen based on the evidence in front of you.



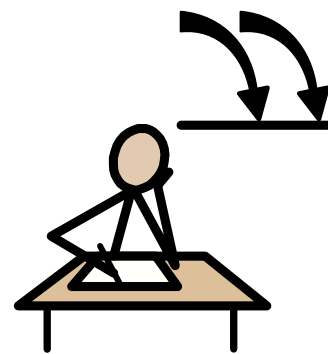
Hypothesise

To organise information in a word and picture map to show how ideas are linked together.



Evaluate

To assess the value of an idea by looking at its important features.



Revising

Going over important information again to make sure you have learned and understood it.
